Subject Outline & Competencies

Description	This module, with learning activities aligned to the Graduate Foundation in Law pedagogy, develops understanding and awareness of a selected area of Tort Law and associated skills as detailed in the Learning Outcomes below.
Learning Outcomes	By successfully completing this module, the learner will be able to, in the context of Tort Law: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Analyse a client scenario, identifying and summarising clearly personal and commercial interests, and legal issues relevant to stakeholders. 2. Locate and interpret relevant law. 3. Locate relevant secondary sources on issues of debate in the law. 4. Apply law to advise on stakeholders' rights, obligations and remedies. 5. Explain and discuss issues of debate in the law. 6. Communicate in oral form an awareness and understanding of relevant law.
Content	This module includes audio-visual media, an extract from the CoLP foundations textbook, and additional directed reading. <p>Learning activities include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Viewing audio-visual media on relevant law in context 2. Directed reading 3. Analysing a client scenario

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4. Applying law to advise parties
 5. Considering issues of debate in the law
 6. Communicating advice in online workshop
 7. Discussing issues of debate in the law

Content and learning activities 1-4 will be via Canvas. Learning activities 5-6 will take place in a synchronous workshop via Zoom, facilitated by a CoLP supervisor.

Assessment Summative assessment is based upon two assessment tasks:

1. Scenario analysis
2. Issue analysis
